Projects Summary

Through its projects across Lebanon, CVC Charity has supported 14,304 vulnerable community members across four key areas: Emergency relief, Protection, Education, and Livelihoods. Support includes essential food and hygiene assistance, PSS sessions, support for persons with disabilities, child protection activities, education initiatives such as the school bus, and English and employability skills for young women and graduates. Building on this work, CVC Charity's upcoming Peace building & social cohesion projects will further strengthen community connections, participation, and resilience, creating safer, more inclusive, and more connected communities. Through strong partnerships, dedicated teams, and community-based action, CVC Charity transforms assistance into meaningful and lasting support.

SHELTER AND RELIEF

CVC Charity’s emergency response provides essential assistance to individuals and families facing difficult circumstances across Lebanon. With the support of partners and volunteers, CVC Charity delivered meals, sandwiches, and hygiene kits to communities across different regions. Through these efforts, 122 individuals received cold meals; 4,400 individuals and families received freshly prepared sandwiches, and 1,604 people received ready-to-eat and hot meals. In addition, 467 families received hygiene kits to support their health and basic wellbeing. Across every initiative, CVC Charity’s careful coordination, teamwork, and flexibility helped turn immediate assistance into meaningful support, providing communities with dignity, care, and hope during difficult times.

EDUCATION

CVC Charity supported 692 children and youth through its education programs, providing access to learning opportunities and responding to the diverse educational needs of children and young people.

In Bar Elias, Aman School supported 262 children and adolescents, providing them with access to safe and supportive education and helping them continue their learning in a stable environment.

In Majdal Anjar, the Special Needs Education Hub (SNEH) supported 30 children with special needs, providing tailored education and learning support in an inclusive and supportive environment. The program helps children develop their skills, confidence, and independence according to their individual needs.

In Gaza, School in a Bus (SIAB) reached around 400 children and youth, bringing education directly to children living in camps. The mobile classroom provides learning in Arabic, English, mathematics, and science, alongside psychosocial support.

PEACEBUILDING & SOCIAL COHESION

The launch of the Peacebuilding & Social Cohesion Program marks an important expansion of CVC Charity’s programming. By connecting human rights, civic participation, creative expression, psychosocial wellbeing, memory, and community dialogue, the program seeks to address not only the consequences of conflict, but also some of the divisions and vulnerabilities that can prevent communities from moving forward.

The coming period will focus on building partnerships, strengthening local leadership, developing creative peacebuilding activities, and expanding opportunities for youth and women to become active contributors to peace and social cohesion.

Preserving Women’s Memories Through Creative Writing

As one of the first activities under the new Peacebuilding & Social Cohesion Program, CVC Charity brought creative writing sessions to shelters, creating a safe space for women to reflect on their experiences, identities, memories, and connection to their communities. The sessions focused particularly on women from

the South, giving participants an opportunity to write about their experiences, their lives as women, and their memories of the places they came from. Through creative writing, personal memories were transformed into stories that could be preserved and shared. Participants produced a collection of personal stories reflecting different experiences and memories connected to the South. These stories will be compiled into a book called “who am I “, which is scheduled to be released soon.

The book represents an important first step in a larger project aimed at documenting and preserving the memories and lived experiences of women. By placing women at the center of the storytelling process, the initiative creates space for voices that are often underrepresented in conventional narratives of conflict and displacement.

From Memory to Peacebuilding

Who am I book demonstrates CVC Charity’s distinctive approach to peacebuilding: using art, storytelling, and media as tools for dialogue, healing and memory preservation, rather than viewing peacebuilding only through the lens of formal dialogue or political processes, CVC Charity seeks to begin with people and their stories. Preserving memories allows communities to acknowledge their experiences, strengthen their sense of identity, and create

narratives that can contribute to understanding and reconciliation. The program will continue to build on this approach through future activities including peacebuilding workshops, storytelling and film initiatives, community dialogues, youth and women leadership activities, public campaigns, exhibitions, and policy dialogues.

Through these efforts, CVC Charity aims to contribute to stronger social cohesion, increased participation of youth and women in civic processes, and, in the longer term, more inclusive and sustainable peace.

Protection and Basic Assistance

Across Lebanon, communities affected by conflict are rebuilding, turning once quiet spaces into places for people to come together, reconnect, and create a stronger future. Among the strongest signs of renewal are the voices, laughter, and smiles of children, women, and families who continue to rebuild their lives with hope.

At a collective shelter, 42 children participated in a football activity, providing them with a safe space for recreation, interaction, and peer engagement.

Through its Community Protection and Wellbeing Project, CVC Charity provided protection and psychosocial support through its Injaz Center in North Lebanon, where 101 children and 81 women participated in Focused Psychosocial Support (FPSS) sessions. The sessions provided structured psychosocial support while also helping identify protection concerns and facilitate referrals to specialized services when needed. Caregivers and families were also supported to promote children's wellbeing and safer, more supportive environments. CVC Charity also continued to strengthen protection

awareness within communities. Through the Hope, Harmony, and Dignity Project, Explosive Ordnance Risk Education (EORE) sessions in Saida and Mount Lebanon reached 160 women and men, helping participants understand explosive ordnance risks and adopt safer behaviors. In Mount Lebanon, 16 persons with disabilities participated in events and activities promoting inclusion, participation, and dignity.

Alongside these activities, CVC Charity provided cash assistance to 576 vulnerable children and families through the Orphan Hope Project, helping families meet their immediate needs.

Livelihoods

Through its Youth Employability Support Project, CVC Charity provided 40 young women and recent graduates with English language and communication training designed to strengthen their personal and professional skills and support their preparation for future education and employment opportunities. The training followed an interactive and practical approach, moving beyond traditional language instruction. Participants used digital learning tools, group discussions, collaborative activities, practical projects, and presentations to develop their English language skills while practicing communication and teamwork in different settings. These activities encouraged participants to express their ideas, work collaboratively, solve problems, and communicate more effectively with others.

A key focus of the sessions was building participants' confidence in using English in practical situations. Through regular opportunities to speak, present, and participate in discussions, participants practiced public speaking and self-expression while developing their ability to communicate clearly with others. The training also helped participants become more comfortable working as part of a team and sharing their ideas in front of others.

These skills are particularly relevant for young women and recent graduates preparing to enter or progress in the workforce, where effective communication can play an important role in job interviews, professional interactions, teamwork, and workplace communication. By combining language learning with practical employability skills, the project provided participants with a broader set of tools to support their personal and professional development. Because sometimes, a new opportunity begins with something as simple as learning how to say, "I can."
